Overview

Sundborn Children's House serves twenty-five 2½ to 6 year olds in Albany. The program goals are to meet the social, intellectual, physical and emotional needs of children by offering a child-centered environment in a warm, loving and secure atmosphere. The program is based on Dr. Montessori's philosophy and educational methods which foster self-awareness and independence built through repeated experiences of personal success and self-mastery.

The name Sundborn comes from the name of the village where the Swedish painter, Karl Larsson, and his wife, Karin, raised their family in late nineteenth century, shortly after Maria Montessori was born. His love and respect of children were reflected in the cozy house he and Karin created.

Staff

The Director of the school, Karen Madsen-Barton, has been actively involved in the Montessori community of the Northwest for over 30 years. She has guided children of these ages in six different classrooms and directed the Overlake Montessori School in Bellevue, Washington. In addition to her B.A. degree from the University of Washington, she has taken the Association Montessori Internationale training at the Montessori Institute Northwest in Portland, Oregon.

Karen and her husband, Keith, are parents of two grown sons and live with a horse, three goats, two Toulouse geese, four cats and their dog in north Benton County.

The staff also includes two assistants.
